At Head-Royce, we are very clear about exactly what middle schoolers need. They are not overgrown elementary school kids or miniature high schoolers. The middle school years constitute a distinctive period of rapid growth and development—intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally.

Our integrated Middle School program includes literature, music, language, history, math, science labs, and hands-on art activities. As they progress through the program, students master the analytical, critical thinking, and writing skills they will need to confidently tackle high school academics. Middle schoolers enjoy expanded opportunities for real-world problem-solving, creativity, and intellectual engagement.

Study skills are incorporated into Advising classes and throughout the school day.

Middle School students are supplied with a school-owned Chromebook to use as an educational tool throughout the school year.



All students take physical education and can participate in athletic teams, including baseball, basketball, cross country, flag football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, tennis, track and field, and volleyball.



Middle Schoolers enjoy outdoor education adventures that include camping, hiking, sea kayaking, river rafting, and a ropes course.


